New Grant from the Lottery

Great News! The Pasture has recently been awarded an 'Awards for All' grant (a fund of the Big Lottery) of nearly £10,000 which will enable us to complete most of the capital works outlined in the Management Plan. We can now put up a noticeboard and a panoramic sign interpreting the extensive view over Finchley at the new pedestrian gate by the railway bridge, remove an area polluted by dumped oil which is seeping down a main path killing the grass, install visitor counters, and buy more wildlife plants for the butterfly border and embankment.

Winter Wildlife

The new bird feeding station is proving very popular with many small birds including **robins**, **blue and great tits**, **chaffinches**, **and house sparrows**. Winter visitors have included **redwings** and several flocks of **waxwings**. A **snipe** flew up from the grass in January – a first for the Pasture. A pair of ducks (**mallard**) are now on the pond nearly every day seriously investigating the floating island as a suitable nesting site. A **sparrowhawk** and **green woodpecker** are seen on a regular basis. **Hazel** and **willow** catkins are blooming. **Frogspawn** has now appeared in ditches and ponds – you can find out more about the Pasture's pond life on 16th April (see over for all **2011 special events**).

Winning at Waitrose

Long Lane Pasture is one of three charities to benefit from the Community Matters scheme at **Waitrose**, **Ballards Lane**, **North Finchley** during **March 2011**. Up the Workers!

The autumn and winter months are when we undertake a lot of management work on the Pasture. The **grass has been flail mowed** then hay removed to keep down brambles, new areas of bramble have been **cleared from the embankment**, more **trees and shrubs planted** and existing plants **weeded and mulched**. **Bulrushes** were thinned from the pond. **Flowering plants** have been added to the Butterfly Border. **A huge thank you to everyone who has helped.** But, we do need more help – it's not just physical work.

April 16th Pond Life
